Job Description:

Nukik is offering an exciting opportunity for a Summer Student to join our team May through August 2025. This position provides valuable hands-on experience in community-based research and baseline data collection, contributing to the development of the Kivalliq Hydro-Fibre Link.

As a Summer Student, you will assist in a variety of tasks, including:

- **Learning** about baseline data collection and its role in project decision-making, while gaining insights into the research process.
- **Supporting** fieldwork activities, interviews, workshops, and community engagement with local members, Elders, knowledge keepers, community leaders, and resource users.
- **Assisting** with the collection of qualitative data and community-based information, including environmental, social, and cultural data.

Specific duties will include:

- **Data collection:** Documenting community perspectives and environmental observations from interviews, engagements, and fieldwork to inform project decisions.
- **Archaeological Fieldwork:** Assisting with the excavation and documentation of historical and cultural sites.
- **Community Engagement:** Facilitating connections with community members so that their voices may be reflected in the data collection process.
- **Environmental Monitoring:** Collecting data on local wildlife and ecosystems, contributing to the baseline data that guides Project planning.

The position offers an invaluable opportunity to gain experience in community-based research and understand how local knowledge influences decision-making for large projects. You will work closely with professionals and community members, developing skills in data collection, research methodologies, and community engagement.

By the end of the summer, you'll have practical experience in environmental science, archaeology, social sciences, and related fields, positioning you well for future career opportunities with Nukik and beyond.



Eligibility Requirements:

- This opportunity is open to individuals who are Inuit Beneficiaries registered under Nunavut Agreement, and aged 18 to 30.
- The applicant must be a high school graduate.
- The applicant must be enrolled as a full-time student at a recognized post-secondary institution (college or university) for the 2024-2025 academic year and intends to return to full-time studies in the fall of 2025.
- The applicant should be willing and able to travel within the Kivalliq region and to Winnipeg for up to 5 days at a time, as required.

Desired Skills and Background:

- Preference will be given to those who live in or have a strong connection with the Kivalliq region.
- Applicants pursuing post-secondary studies in fields such as environmental science, environmental studies, geography, biology, anthropology, geology, and Indigenous studies are preferred.
- Fluency in Inuktitut is preferred but not required.
- The applicant should demonstrate a commitment to upholding Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit principles.
- The applicant should be eager to learn and take on new tasks.
- Strong communication skills, with the ability to explain ideas clearly and actively listen to others, are important.
- The applicant should be able to work as part of a team.
- The applicant should have the ability to complete tasks on time and independently.
- The applicant should be adaptable and open to handling unexpected situations as they arise.
